Filmed by Oscar-nominated director Judith Ehrlich one year before Ellsberg's death, *An Ordinary Insanity* offers an urgent and deeply human look at the dangers built into U.S. nuclear policy, while pointing toward concrete steps that can reduce the risk of nuclear annihilation. Ellsberg was also a longtime participant in Livermore Lab Hiroshima and Nagasaki commemorations, bringing his voice, moral clarity, and call for nuclear abolition to August actions over many years.
